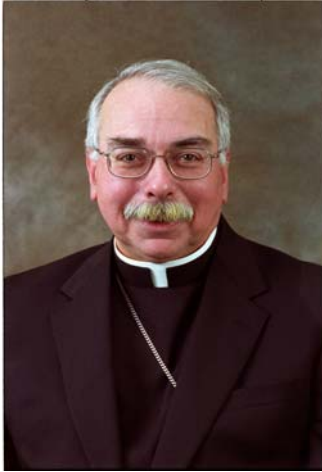

Bishop Frederick F. Campbell was born August 5, 1943, in Elmira, New York, the second of six children born to Edward and Dorothy Campbell. He graduated magna cum laude with a Bachelor of Arts Degree in History and Foreign Language from Saint Lawrence University, Canton, New York, in 1965, and obtained an Master of Arts Degree in History in 1967 and a Doctorate in History in 1973, both from the Ohio State University, Columbus, Ohio. Prior to entering the seminary, he served as a history teacher at the Pontifical College Josephinum in Columbus, Ohio, 1967-1969, and as an assistant professor of history at California State College in San Bernardino, California, 1970-1976.

From 1976 to 1980, Campbell studied at the Saint Paul Seminary, Saint Paul, Minnesota, and was ordained a priest of the Archdiocese of Saint Paul and Minneapolis by the Most Reverend John R. Roach at the Cathedral of Saint Paul, Saint Paul, on May 31, 1980. From 1980 to 1987, he served as Associate Pastor at Saint Charles Borromeo Church, Saint Anthony, Minnesota. From 1987 to 1994, he served as Pastor at Saint John the Evangelist Church, Hopkins, Minnesota, and from 1991 to 1994, he was Canonical Administrator of John Ireland School, Hopkins. In 1994, he was appointed Pastor of Saint Joseph Church, West Saint Paul, Minnesota, where he served through 1999.

On March 2, 1999, Pope John Paul II named Father Campbell Titular Bishop of Afufenia and Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of Saint Paul and Minneapolis. On May 14, 1999, he was ordained a Bishop at the Cathedral of Saint Paul, Saint Paul, by Archbishop Harry J. Flynn.

As of July, 2002, Bishop Campbell began service as Rector and Vice President of the Saint Paul Seminary School of Divinity of the University of St. Thomas, St. Paul. Bishop Campbell served as Chairman of the Bishops Committee on the Diaconate from 2004 to 2006. On October 14, 2004, Pope John Paul II appointed him Bishop of Columbus. He was installed as the 11th Bishop of Columbus at St. Joseph Cathedral, Columbus, on January 13, 2005.

Presently, Bishop Campbell sits on the boards of the Columbus Coalition Against Family Violence, Mother Angeline McCrory Manor, and the Pontifical College Josephinum, where he is the Vice Chancellor of the College.
