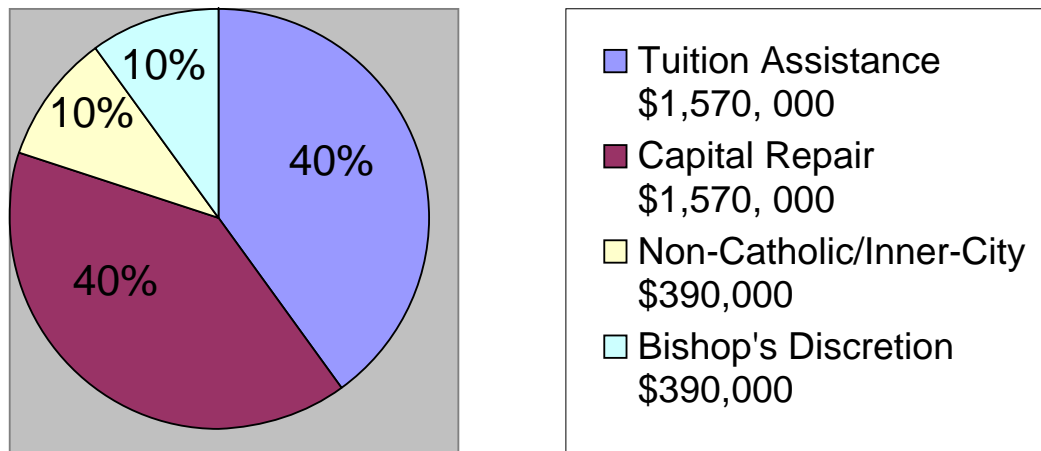

We responded enthusiastically as a community and the Legacy of Catholic Learning Endowment was established for the purpose of addressing four needs:

- Tuition assistance for students with financial need in Franklin and Delaware Counties
- Capital repairs for Franklin County Catholic high schools
- Scholarships for non-Catholic/inner-city students
- The Bishop's Discretionary Fund
